What no one knows, however, is that Sara's drive comes from her feelings towards her teacher and mentor, Marlena. Feelings that she's never questioned until now.



And Amandine, part of a venerated family of vampires, has been turned much younger than she expected to be after a car accident nearly killed her. The two of them form a fast friendship—both feel a little out of step with their old lives, and as a bonus, it turns out that Amandine's new vampire abilities can help Perley save money on blood glucose tests. But as the year goes on, they're forced to admit that maybe their coping strategies—and their blood-sipping-turned-romance—aren't working out so well after all. Will they be able to get their lives back to normal? Or will both have to figure out new ways for their "normal" to look?


It makes me wonder . . . how much of my childhood was real.


A middle-grade graphic novel about Tony, an energetic preteen that loves all things cool and geeky, but struggles with mental health issues and self-doubt.

Eleven-year-old Tony Weaver, Jr. loves comic books, anime, and video games, and idolizes the heroic, larger-than-life characters he finds there. But his classmates all think he's a weirdo. Ostracized and bullied by his peers, Tony struggles with the hurt and depression of not being accepted and hopes that if he can conform to other people's expectations, those feelings might dissipate. But, try as he might, he is unsuccessful and spirals deeper into the dark thoughts and feelings that plague him. Cut off from his peers and the media he loves, and unaware of how to broach the subject of his feelings and seek help, Tony attempts suicide.

In the wake of his unsuccessful attempt, Tony's family surrounds him with love and support, and his life begins to change for the better. Tony starts seeing a therapist to talk through his feelings and enrolls in a new school whose aim is to foster creativity. As Tony navigates a new school, new friendships, and first crushes, he finds himself growing into the hero he's always aspired to be. Tony ultimately learns to love himself and discovers that the unique qualities that set him—and set all of us apart, ones that make us all weirdos—are, in fact, our superpowers.

by Jordan Morris; illustrated by Bowen McCurdy



When Kay reluctantly agreed to join the youth group at Stone Mission Church in Orange County California, she expected the Jesus talk and the dorky singalongs and the colorful posters about dodging temptation. What she didn't expect was to stumble on her youth group leaders, Meg and Cortland, in the middle of a read-deal exorcism. Turns out they're both soldiers in a secret organization of demon hunters in a war that's heating up, and even if Kay wanted to stay on the sidelines, she doesn't have a choice—she's a "Blight," a human who demons can't possess, and apparently that's made her a target.

Will Kay find her place in a world that's so much more God-fearing and monster-fighting than what she's used to? Will the Stone Mission youth group find common cause with their badass peers of other faiths? Or will a pack of small-time demons use Blights like Kay as the key to starting some real big trouble?





MONSTER LOCKER by Jorge Aguirre; illustrated by Andrés Vera Martínez



There's something lurking in the basement of Glenfield Middle School. For hundreds of years, it's hidden in the shadows, waiting for its chance to open a portal into the realm of monsters and unleash the forces of chaos on the earth. Now, its time has come. The school is going to need a hero.

Sixth-grader Pablo Ortiz. . . isn't that guy. What kind of hero is afraid of ghost stories, bullies, and dancing at their sister's quinceañera? All he wants to do is lay low, blend in, and get through middle school in one piece. But when Pablo accidentally opens the portal to the monster realm and summons a vengeful Aztec earth goddess to the hallways of Glenfield Middle, "laying low" isn't an option. It will take the butt-kicking skills of his new friends Takashi and Maggie, the wisdom (and weapons) passed down by his abuela, and a thermos full of spicy xocolatl to take on the goddess Coatlicue. But can he conquer his own fears in time to save his city?





UPROOTED by Ruth Chan

A debut middle grade graphic novel about one girl's displacement and desire to belong when she moves from Canada to Hong Kong, her ancestral home but also a place that feels foreign.

The last thing Ruth Chan wants to do is move, especially when that means leaving the best friends in the world in Toronto, Canada. But when her dad gets an offer for a fancy new job in Hong Kong—where her mother grew up and still has family—Ruth is suddenly uprooted.

Everything in Hong Kong is different: school is harder, she has to make new friends, her Cantonese isn't good enough, and her parents are never around. It all comes to a head when Ruth begins to fail her classes.

But Ruth thinks of the stories her father tells her about his childhood—how he and his family survived wartime China and found strength and bravery in themselves and each other. With those stories in her heart, Ruth finds the courage and determination to finally make Hong Kong her home.

Beloved for her viral Instagram comics, Ruth Chan channels her signature charm, humor, and heartrending voice into her debut graphic novel memoir. 












WILDFLOWER EMILY by Lydia Corry
