# SCRIBBLE by Gavin Aung Than

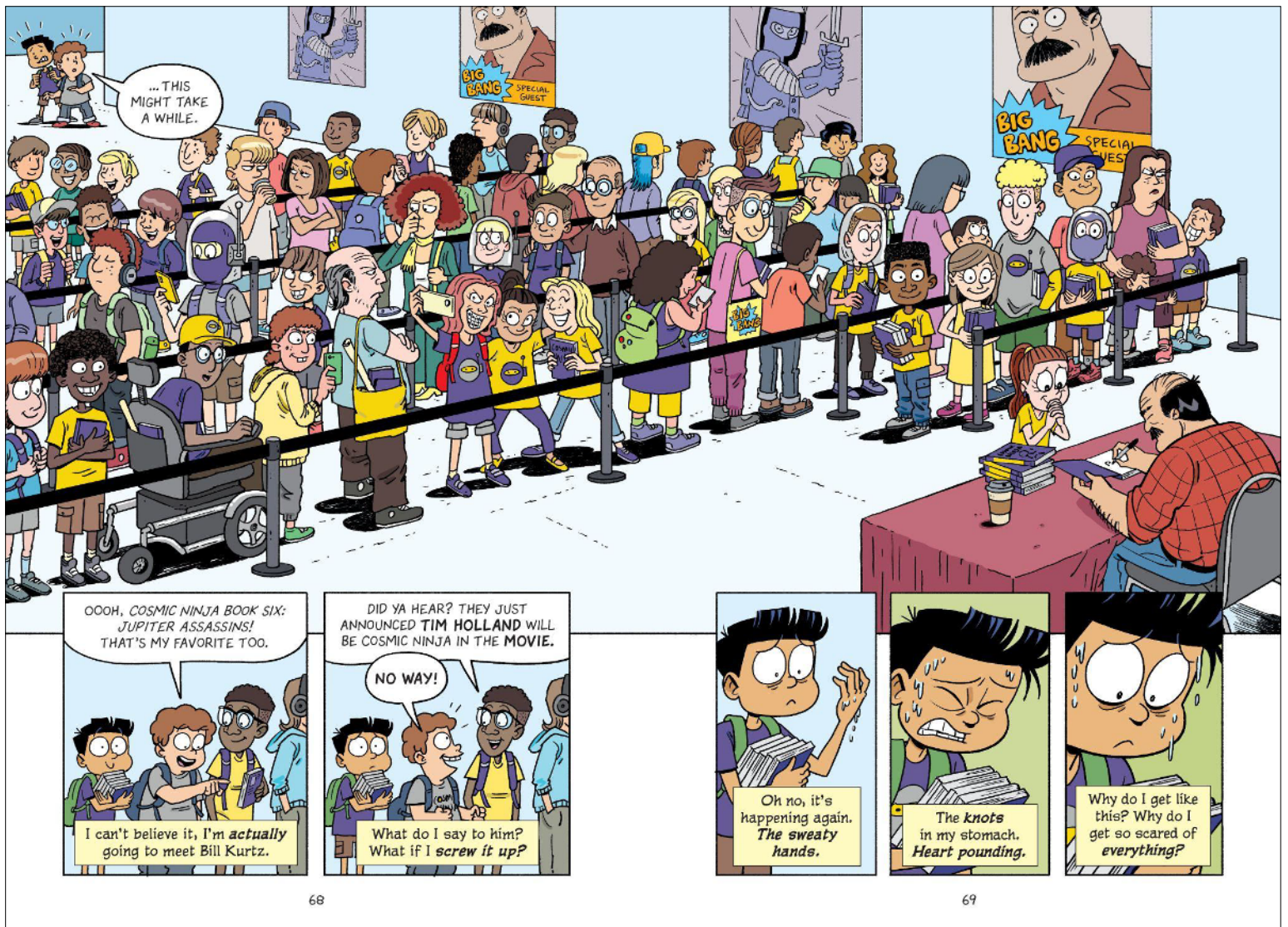

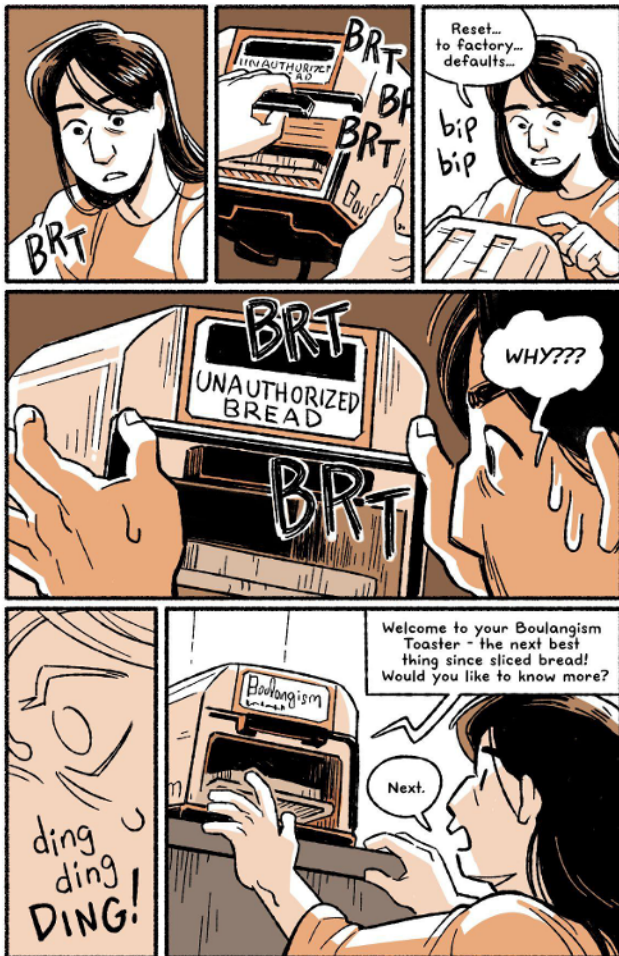

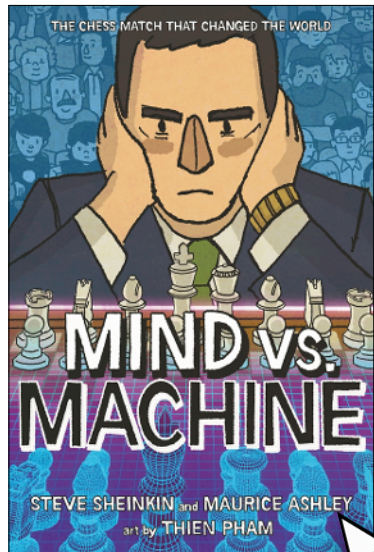

Little Red Riding Hood is swallowed by a wolf, and later rescued by a kindly Woodcutter.

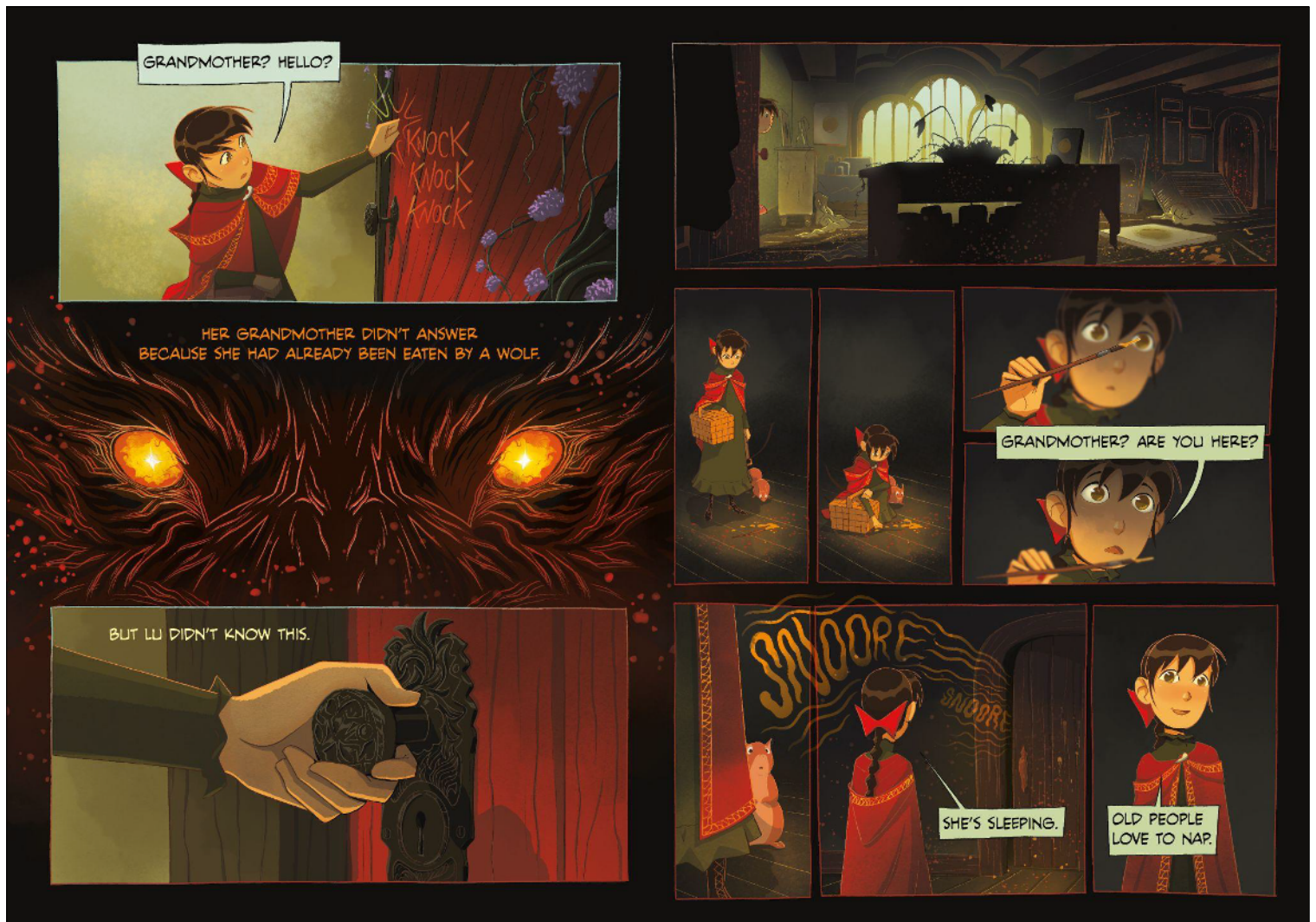

## **LOVE LIGHT** by Mela Rogers

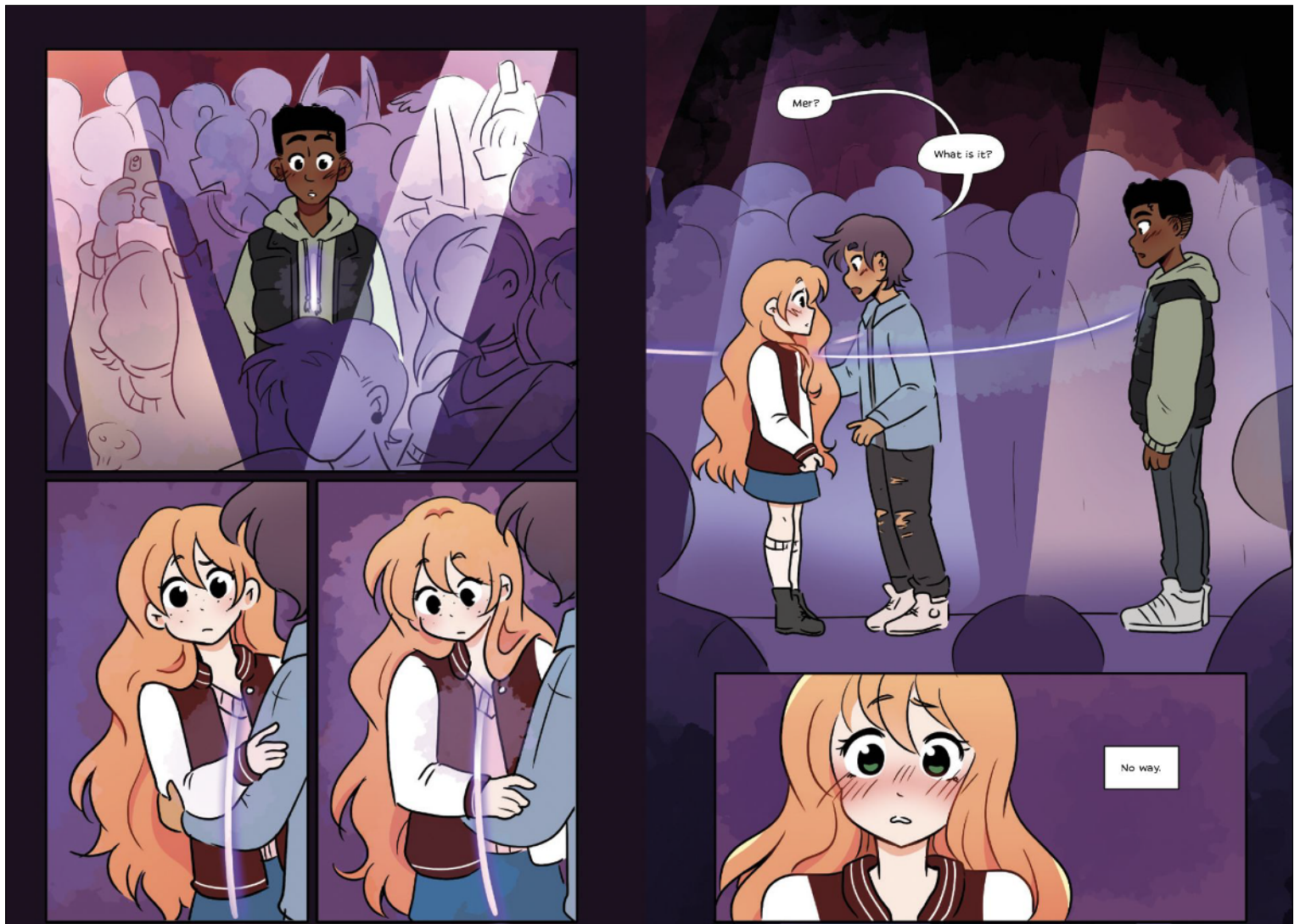

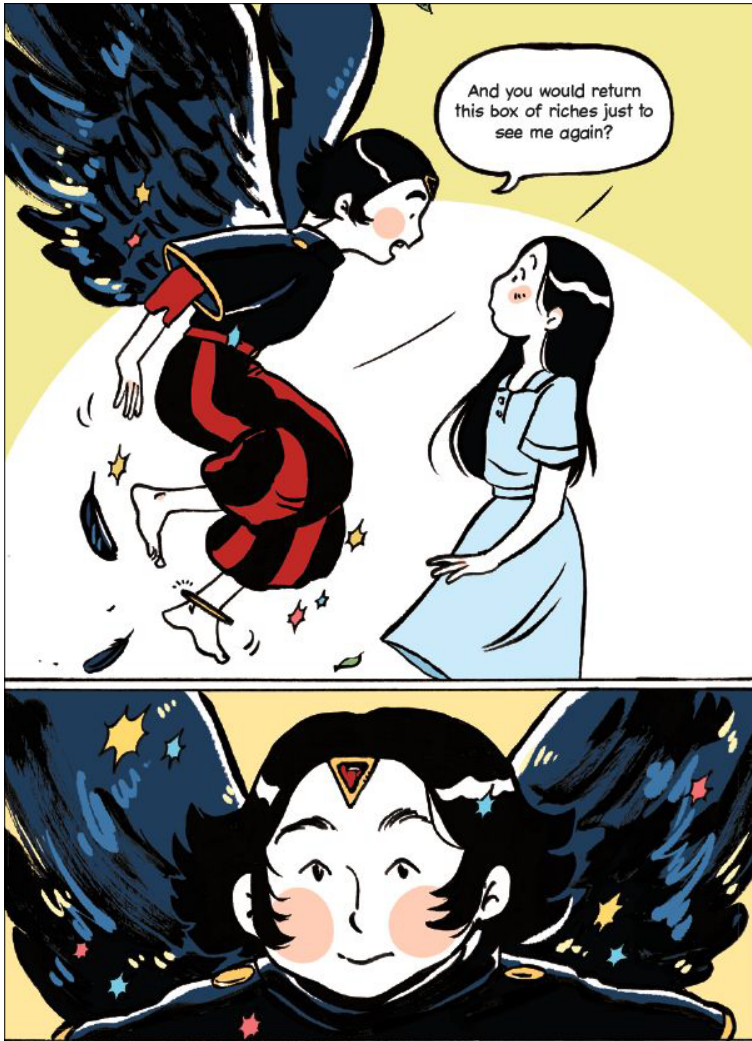
# THE CROW PRINCESS by Vivian Zhou
